The Hidden System That Explains How Your Doctor Makes Referrals

More primary-care doctors work directly for hospitals, and they are being pushed to keep lucrative referrals in-house



Patients are often in the dark about why their doctors referred them to a particular physician or facility. Increasingly, those calls are being driven by pressure to keep business within a hospital system, even if an outside referral might benefit the patient, according to documents and interviews with doctors, hospital executives and lawyers.
